- **6. Empowering Survivors:** Our mission is to empower foster children to break the cycle of abuse. Through ongoing support and advocacy, we'll equip them with the tools needed to thrive and advocate for change.

In envisioning this future, I am filled with hope and determination, but Joshua House will need your continued support. Together, we can be a beacon of light, offering safety, support, and the chance for abused children to reclaim their childhoods. Thank you for your unwavering dedication. 



CHILD ABUSE AWARENESS BENEFIT SHINES LIGHT ON THE FUTURE OF JOSHUA HOUSE

On April 11, 2024, nearly 400 guests gathered at Armature Works for a futuristic themed luncheon to support a community effort that is mission critical: the Future of Joshua House. Now in its 32nd year, the Child Abuse Awareness Benefit has inspired and moved guests every year, but this year was one of the most anticipated and well-received due in large part to two impactful speakers. Matthew Michini was honored with the prestigious Founders Starlight Award. His acts of service, including securing funding to replace HVACs on the entire property of Joshua House as well as connecting Joshua House with contractors to help with vital infrastructure repairs, reminded us all that every single one of us can make a small connection that can result in a big difference.

The highlight of the event was the impactful speech delivered by Dr. Terry Morris, a distinguished NASA engineer who we were honored to have as our keynote speaker. Dr. Morris' words resonated deeply with the audience as he shared his own personal life experience with devastating abuse, neglect, and abandonment by his biological family. He credited help and care from a group home very much like Joshua House to his ultimate success throughout high levels of schooling and into his career at NASA.

Executive Director for Friends of Joshua House, DeDe Grundel, in her heartfelt presentation, shed light on the stark realities faced by abused children in Hillsborough County and across Florida. Her words underscored the vital role that a special place like Joshua House plays in the lives of abused and neglected children, offering them not just shelter, but also healing, guidance, and the promise of a brighter future.

In the words of Dr. Terry Morris, "Only because there was a place for me to go, for people to show me kindness, that made the difference in my life. I was at the precipice. I could have chosen to go either way...it was that there was a place like Joshua House."

As we reflect on the success of this event, let us carry its spirit forward, continuing to shine a light on the darkness of child abuse and support the work of Joshua House to help create a world where every child is cherished, valued, and safe from harm. And let us remember that the future of Joshua House depends on the support of our own community to be able to continue the important mission of keeping safe the deserving children who need us the most.
